



International Student Policy

1. Preference is given to students from Christian families.
2. Students must live with a Christian, English-speaking family in the GTA. They may not live on their own or with other students. The student's family will be responsible for arranging their child's accommodation needs.
3. Students must have a guardian. The guardian information must be complete on the *Visa/Residential Form for International Students*.
4. Each student is assessed on previous academic record, a family commitment to support the educational philosophy of PCA and a personal interview. At the discretion of the principal, a further written assessment may be requested.
5. Students and their parents must complete and sign the enclosed ***Application for Admission form*** and complete the ***Visa/Residential Information Form for International Students***. They must be submitted with a copy of the student's birth certificate or passport and a copy of the student's academic history.
6. When a student is accepted he/she will receive a letter of conditional admission after the tuition fees are paid and a copy of the health insurance is provided. Tuition is \$19,670.00, per academic year (September to June). For each Grade 6-12 student, an Incidental Fee of \$200.00 is to be added to the listed tuition fee. Payment is to be made by bank draft or certified cheque payable to PCA.

Tuition fees are non-refundable unless the student is refused a student visa by Canadian Immigration, at which point, a full refund will be issued less the administrative fee of \$1,000.00.
7. To be admitted, students must obtain a Canadian student visa after they are accepted by the school and before the first day of school.

Canadian Immigration and your Visa

1. If you are not a Canadian or permanent resident, you must have a Canadian student visa in order to study in Canada.
2. To receive a Canadian student visa you must have a letter of acceptance from a school.
3. PCA will issue the letter of acceptance after the full tuition fees are paid and a copy of the health insurance is provided. You have to take this letter to the Canadian immigration office in your country of origin to be issued a student visa.
4. Visa renewal: After you are a student, always be sure to pay school fees, receive a letter of acceptance for the next year and report to immigration for a visa renewal for the next academic year. Do this **before** your visa expires.
5. If your visa expires, it is difficult, if not impossible to have it renewed and you may be asked to return to your home country.
6. Please check with Canadian immigration to confirm that there have been no changes in government policy. The above information is valid at the time of this publication.
